
• OSOR is an observatory that provides **FOSS expertise and information** to serve as middle-ground for connecting

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


Legal initiatives addressing open source software

LEGAL Decrees Directives Laws Parliamentary Resolutions

Specific legal open source software initiatives

Ayrault Circular (2012)



Defines the general orientations for the use of OSS in public administration. Free software must be considered equal to other solutions.

OSS Directive (2012)



Instructs all agencies to give preference to the use of open source software throughout government.

Code of Digital Administration (2013)



Makes it mandatory for Italy's public administrations to use free and open source software solutions, as stipulated in Article 68.

Decree 1236/2016



Requires the creation of "provisions to propagate software built on open standards and open source software in the public sector while maintaining the efficiency of public administration" through interministerial cooperation.

Decree 1604/2016



Follow-up legislation on the adoption of open source software in the public sector and the measures necessary for the dissemination of OSS based on open standards in the public sector.

Decree no. 2017-683 (2017)




Specifies the families of open source software licences that can be used for administrative documents that are communicable and reusable.
